Vision

To set and advance the agenda of restoration of identified degraded landscapes through voluntary collaboration of national nodal institutions, experts, organizations to facilitate the fulfilment of the global restoration objectives and targets in the Kunming Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, SDGs including Land Degradation Neutrality (SDG 15.3) and the UN Decade for Ecosystem Restoration



Mission

- 1 Shaping the global agenda for restoration of identified priority landscapes
- 2 Creating a network of nodal institutions or organizations or experts, as appropriate to enable knowledge sharing and capacity building
- Building a knowledge platform to enhance capacity of organizations/individuals engaged in restoration activities
- Identifying and supporting lighthouse projects that can demonstrate measurable impacts and act as a template for restoration of identified landscapes
